

### c. Geopolitical analysis

#### 1. Social, cultural and demographic context

Mali has a population of 20 million, composed of several ethnic groups. Although French is the official language, most people speak a national language. Mali is a landlocked country and one of the 48 least developed countries (LDCs) in terms of its socio-economic development, with an economy that is still predominantly rural. The security situation in Mali remains concerning, particularly in the country's central and northern regions, where violence is increasing constantly.



#### 2.Political situation

The Algiers Agreement signed in June 2015 was intended to restore peace and security to North Mali. This agreement provides for the disarmament of armed groups and greater powers for the regions. Since the beginning of 2018, however, central Mali has been the theatre of armed conflict between radical groups. And since 2020, the peace agreement has been challenged by a part of Malian public opinion. Strong opposition to its application regularly causes tension between the various parties.

The Algiers Agreement Monitoring Committee, chaired by Algeria, met in September 2022 to try to resolve the obstacles to its implementation. However, the peace agreement continues to meet with strong resistance from some quarters. This pressure has led the Coordination des Mouvements de l'Azawad (CMA) to withdraw from the workings of the Committee and from the constitutional referendum process. On several occasions, the CMA has denounced violations of the agreement and attacks on its positions by the Malian air force. This has rekindled tensions between the signatory parties in the context of the withdrawal of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilisation Mission in Mali, intended to mark the handover of all its bases to the Malian armed forces by December 2023.

#### 3. Socio-economic context

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, compounded by a coup d'état in August 2020 and the economic and banking sanctions imposed by the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) during the first half of 2022, the country went from strong economic growth of 5.1% of real GDP in 2019 to a recession in 2020, when real GDP dropped by 2%. Today, Mali's economy is still overly dependent on the primary sector, which employs 68% of the working population. The Malian diaspora also contributes to national GDP. Unemployment remains extremely high at around 21.5%. Mali is a member of many regional organisations including ECOWAS, the African Union and the Sahel.

Through the 2023 United Nations Humanitarian Response Plan for Mali, humanitarian partners are seeking \$751.4 million to assist 5.7 million people. The analysis carried out as part of this plan covers all the humanitarian challenges, but the response focuses on the priority needs of the most vulnerable people.



## Summary of HI's work in the country

HI has been present in Mali since 1993, and has sound knowledge of the political and security context and the country's specific socio-cultural characteristics, as well as 30 years' experience of working with the authorities and the country's most vulnerable communities. In 2022, HI implemented 18 projects in the sectors of protection (including the conduct of rapid protection assessments following population displacements), health and rehabilitation, resilience and food security, inclusive education, and logistical support for the delivery of humanitarian aid.

HI also has considerable operational and management capacity in Mali. In addition to the main base in Bamako, HI has permanent staff in Mopti, Timbuktu and Gao. HI has acquired contextual, technical and organisational expertise, and has the capacity to deploy in hard-to-reach areas, working with national and decentralised authorities and supporting the most vulnerable communities.

In 2023, the programme ran activities in the following sectors:

- Health & Prevention: functional rehabilitation, mother and child health and disability & HIV advocacy:
- Physical and functional rehabilitation: early detection and case management of disabilities;
- Social and inclusion: inclusive education, socio-professional inclusion, distributions for the development of livelihood activities
- Protection & Risk reduction: risk education on explosive devices, assistance to victims of armed conflict and conflict transformation in northern and central Mali. Cross-cutting protection: protection is incorporated into the different projects implemented by HI in Mali, including child protection, the management of gender-based violence, and the inclusion of the specific needs of people with disabilities and minorities;
- Mental health and psychosocial support: Reduction of stress/occupational burnout for staff, liaison psychology for people with disabilities and vulnerable populations;
- Humanitarian logistics and transport: providing transport (road and river) and pooled warehousing services for at least 40 humanitarian organisations, in order to optimise the delivery of humanitarian supplies and help maintain humanitarian access while reducing transport costs by optimising and pooling the resources dedicated to these activities.
